While we encourage all parents to attend the interviews, teachers will also be sending home pink interview requests in the **Report** envelopes. The **pink notes** will only apply to those students/parents for whom teachers would like to address Semester 2 future directions with.

If parents, however, do not receive a pink interview request and would still like to discuss their child's progress with his/her teacher, then please access the **Skool Loop app** to book to an interview appointment time.



Further to this, early in Semester 2, teachers will be sending home each student's individual learning goals so that parents and students are aware of specific goals to focus on for learning success in 2022.




As mentioned earlier this term, Mrs Mackie has been appointed as the new Assistant Principal Curriculum & Instruction (APC&I). In this role, Mrs Mackie is responsible for introducing effective, evidence-

based literacy and numeracy teaching practices to promote **improved student learning outcomes** across the curriculum.

We would like to invite <u>all Traveller</u> parents to an afternoon Literacy information session on <u>Wednesday 29th June from 3:30-4:30pm</u>, whereby Mrs Mackie will outline the new way of teaching Literacy in 2022, which

is occurring across NSW schools. This will include information about *a shift away from a 'balanced' literacy approach in favour of systematic synthetic phonics and *the use of





decodable readers – phonetically controlled – over predictable/levelled readers. **Please save the date!**

Literacy for K-2

As mentioned below, children in K-2 will be bringing home Decodable Texts to read commencing Term 3.

These books will contain sounds the student has already learnt and practiced at school. They are meant to be simple enough to encourage early success! These texts support beginning readers to develop decoding strategies and practice early reading skills. We also encourage you to read other good quality books that may be available from your local Library or for purchase at Big W or Kmart, to your child at home to develop vocabulary and comprehension. A list of these books will be provided at the Traveller Parent-Teacher information session.





Attendance and Absentee Notifications

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children. Parents and carers can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- helping their child learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- ensuring their child arrives on time from the start of the school day, ready to participate in learning
- reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time
- promptly communicating any absence to the school (within 7 days of the first day of any absence).



We continue to encourage the use of the <u>Skool Loop App</u> for notifications of student absences. It is easy to use and only requires the student's

name, parent's name, date and the reason for absence. The notification is then automatically sent via email to the school account. Parents may also phone the school directly or send in a written note. Please do not message or email the teachers directly. Just a reminder that student absences must be provided upon return to school, on the next school day.

Multicultural Public Speaking Public speaking continues to be an integral part of the NSW K-6 English Syllabus which we fully embrace at Mount Hunter Public School. Public speaking improves young people's overall communication skills, increases self-esteem and confidence, helps them to plan and organise their thoughts, express their ideas in front of the class and

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develops leadership skills. It is an essential skill to learn and master. The finals of the Multicultural Public Speaking are being held this week and next. Two students may be selected to participate in the regional Multicultural Speaking competition next term. Good luck to all participants.

back up to scratch, after the recent rains delayed our efforts to keep the school neat and tidy.


